Thank you for the quick reply and solution! Yes that works and does what I was needing to do. I normally use the WinAmp interface and a single playlist, so it didn't occur to me to try creating a new playlist, then exporting. Also, for some reason in WinAmp interface it's Shift+N instead of Ctrl+T). I still think it'd be a good to add a new "Export Selected" option, if it's fairly trivial to do. It looks like my original idea wouldn't work in the GTK interface, since something is always "selected". What do you think would be best?
